The Pastor Writes

We are praying for and anticipating a great day of worship, praise and celebration on "Miracle Day," June 5, as we celebrate ten years of being in our new facility here at 4675 Cliff Gookin Blvd. We are calling it "Miracle Day" because we are asking God for a miracle of His grace and generosity to overflow into the hearts of His people to the point that we would give and pledge \$1.8 million over the next eighteen months and pay off our building indebtedness by December, 2012. This is a challenge for us, but very achievable for a church our size.



Let me show you what I mean. We have presently 1,035 families who are resident members of Harrisburg Baptist Church. You can easily see that if every family gave \$1,000.00, that would be \$1,035,000.00. If each family gave \$2,000.00, that would be \$2,070,000.00. If each family gave \$3,000.00, that would be \$3,105,000.00. I am not suggesting how much anyone gives because some may not be able to even give \$1,000.00, or even \$500.00, but what I want you to see is that if everyone of our families gives something, we can accomplish this tremendous goal. Some will be able to

give more than even the \$3,000.00 figure in this illustration. I have always believed the concept, "Not equal gifts, but equal sacrifice," when it comes to paying for and paying off church building indebtedness.

You are encouraged to pray and seek God's leadership as we approach June 5. We are all aware that this needs to be above and beyond our normal giving to the ongoing budget needs of our church ministry. I know you will be faithful stewards as we seek to finish the job of paying for our beautiful facility here at Harrisburg.

One of my favorite stories is of a pastor who was trying to raise several hundred thousand dollars to pay off the church debt. This older couple came by, dressed rather poorly and said to the preacher after the service, "We'd like to come and see you tomorrow. We have \$12,000.00 we want to give to the church."

Well, the pastor made the appointment. The next day the couple showed up with a gallon jar stuffed with money. They emptied it on the pastor's desk. They counted every bill and the amount came to \$11,999.00. The old farmer said, "Pastor, that has to be wrong. I know there was \$12,000.00 in this jar. Let's count it again." The preacher said, "Oh, that's alright. I'll just put in the other dollar." The farmer said, "No, I know that there's \$12,000.00 in this jar."

So they counted it again and the amount was still \$11,999.00. The preacher was getting kind of nervous and he said, "Look sir, don't worry about the other dollar. I'll put it in." The farmer said, "Pastor, I know there's \$12,000.00 in that jar. I have counted it several times and I'm not going to give any of it until I can give all of it." He insisted they count it one more time.

The result was exactly the same. There was only \$11,999.00 in the jar. All of a sudden the wife's face brightened up and she looked at her husband and said, "Honey, I know what's wrong. We brought the wrong jar!"

Now, all I ask is that on Sunday, June 5, please remember to bring the right jar. We will receive the "Miracle Day" offering at the very end of the Celebration Service on that day. Of course, you may mail your pledge in if you cannot be present, but plan to give it at the conclusion of the worship service on June 5, "Miracle Day."
